Introductions: Sarah Hubbard-Gray called the meeting to order at 9:10 am. Committee members introduced themselves. Since there was a good variety of interests represented, the group decided that they were comfortable moving forward with decisions that will be included in the first draft Watershed Plan.

Update on Technical Work Elements: Rob Lindsay gave an update on the storage options and indicated that Golder Associates is working on the effort and that they have developed seven objectives. Rob passed out a handout from Golder and requested feedback from the group by the end of the week. Rob also indicated that he has requested input from Stan Miller and that he will also ask for input from the Storage Work Group.

Continue Discussion of Issues and Recommendations: The issues and recommendations associated with Water Conservation, Reclamation and Reuse; Domestic Exempt Wells; and Water Rights and Claims were discussed and the decisions made are incorporated into Chapter 4 Recommended Actions dated June 17, 2004 (included with the June 29, 2004 Planning Unit meeting notice packet).

During the discussion of issues and recommendations, it was suggested that:

• Water Reclamation and Reuse tables should show range of water usage. It was suggested to look at the new USGS report and evaluate if those numbers are accurate and could/should be used.
